

“This policy forms part of, and must be read with, Bunnings’ Supplier Trading Terms”

Greenlife Product Compliance Standards Policy

Plants supplied to Bunnings must comply with the following (in addition to all other requirements of the Supplier Trading Terms). All plants must be supplied free of weeds, pest and diseases when delivered to Bunnings nurseries, as far as is practicable. Plants must be specified on the label. All plants must be labelled specifying variety or cultivar and labels must be appropriately and securely attached to plant or pot.

- The supply of plants that are declared ‘noxious’ in a jurisdiction to which they are to be supplied is prohibited.
- No plant or plant label may infringe any Intellectual Property Rights or protocols such as Breeders Rights, Plant Patenting, Trade Marks or any licensing agreements.
- Where a licence is required by law to grow or harvest plants, a copy of the licence must be supplied to Bunnings.
- Bunnings provides a Plant Quality Check list with which all Green life Products must comply.
- Plants supplied to Bunnings must not have been developed using genetic modifications as part of their breeding program. No genetically modified organisms are acceptable.
- The application of Neonicotinoid (Neonics) insecticides on plants supplied to Bunnings will not be acceptable after December 2020.

It is the responsibility of the Supplier to be aware of all laws, protocols and regulations (including regional requirements) relating to the movement and the sale of plants when supplying to each Bunnings location. If a purchase order is received for plants where delivery would contravene these rules, then you must notify Bunnings’ Greenlife Buyer and the order is not to be fulfilled.

Any plants supplied which fail to meet the above requirements upon delivery to the Greenlife Cross Dock or the store (as applicable) will be immediately returned to the Supplier at the Supplier’s expense. The obligation of Suppliers under the Bunnings Trading Terms to indemnify Bunnings extends to all liabilities, losses, costs and expenses incurred by Bunnings due to any recall or regulatory action because of the Supplier’s failure to meet the above requirements.
